POSTER PRESENTATION

INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF RICE

Rice is the staple food of over half of the world's population, while providing income for millions of rice producers, processors and traders. Rice based production systems and their associated post-harvest operations employ about one billion people in rural areas of developing countries. Rice enters people's lives as a daily food, at religious festivals and wedding parties, in paintings and in songs. Cultivation of the crop has changed landscapes, introduced new cuisine, and provided farmers with new sources of income. Rice is a food - but more than a food. It is society, culture, politics, business, the beauty of the landscape, people in their communities. In short, Rice is Life.

The international year of rice will act as a catalyst to initiate missions aimed at increasing rice production in a sustainable manner. Similar strategy has been successful in the past. Just after World War II, rapid population growth and low rice production led experts to predict starvation in Asia and FAO declared 1966 as Year of Rice which propelled increased research and application of improved technology, leading to the Green Revolution. Rapid acceleration of rice production in the last three decades has been a primary contributor to the world's food security. Despite this, there are about 840 million under-nourished people, including more than 200 million children, in developing countries. Improving and sustaining productivity of rice systems would help to reduce or eradicate this alarming level of hunger.

Rice is also well known for its medicinal uses. In Ayurveda the medicinal value of rice has been described. Rice is considered to be acrid, oleaginous, tonic, aphrodisiac, fattening, diuretic and useful in biliousness. *Navarakizhi* is one of the most important specialized procedures in Ayurveda therapy of Kerala, which utilizes *Navara* rice, as one of the main

ingredient. Apart from medicinal rice, aromatic rice also deserve due attention for their commercial value.

On the occasion of the International Year of Rice 2004, M S Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) and Kerala Agricultural University (KAU) are jointly organizing a **Science-Society Interface on medicinal and aromatic rice**. The event would focus on the importance and potential of medicinal and aromatic rice varieties of Kerala. The Ayurvedic system of medicine in Kerala had been using medicinal rice since very long time. The event will be held at the Regional Agricultural Research Station (RARS), Pattambi, an internationally reputed and leading rice research institution under the Kerala Agricultural University.

M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) is an autonomous non-profit trust advocating a job-led economic growth strategy in rural areas, based on a pro-nature, pro-poor, and pro-women orientation to technology development and dissemination. Designed to converge on a goal of agricultural and rural development rooted in the principles of ecological sustainability, economic efficiency and social and gender equity, MSSRF undertakes activities in the five major programme areas of Coastal Systems Research, Biodiversity and Biotechnology, Ecotechnology and Food Security, Gender and Development and Informatics. A Community Agrobiodiversity Centre (CAbC) established by MSSRF in Wayanad, Kerala is dedicated to empower the local people in documenting, conserving and value adding to medicinal plants and the associated traditional knowledge.

The Kerala Agricultural University is the primary and principal instrumentality of the Kerala State in developing human resources and skills and technology, required for the sustainable development of its agriculture, defined broadly as encompassing all production activities based on land and water, including crop production (agriculture), animal husbandry, forestry and fishery through conducting, interfacing and integrating education, research and extension in these spheres of economic endeavor.



VENUE

The Regional Agricultural Research Station, Pattambi, is located on the banks of the famous river NILA (Bharathapuzha). It is the nerve centre of rice research in Kerala - *God's Own Country* - a land of mesmerizing beauty. Opened by Mr. Viscount Goshen, the colonial Governor of the then Madras Presidency on 12th October 1927, the RARS enjoys historic importance and the rare distinction of releasing *Annapoorna* (Ptb 35), the first high yielding, early maturing, dwarf hybrid derivative of rice in South East Asia, in 1966. RARS, Pattambi is famous across rice growing regions of the world for the development of several commercially valuable elite rice varieties notable with the prefix 'Ptb'. The Station has so far released 57 rice varieties, starting from Aryan (Ptb 1) to Swetha (Ptb 57), suited to the different cropping situations of Kerala.

Located 80 Km from Cochin International Airport, Pattambi is also close to the renowned Guruvayur Sree Krishna Temple. Pattambi is well connected by both rail and road. RARS, Pattambi is 15 km north of Shoranur railway junction and 3 km from Pattambi railway station. All express trains stop at Pattambi station. It is 50 km away from Thrissur, 58 km from Palakkad and 75 km from Calicut. The weather at Pattambi during August will be pleasant, with intermittent showers. The relative humidity will be around 90% and temperature between 22° C · 32° C.

THE PROGRAMME

The programme on the first day will include technical sessions on the indicated topics. The second day will be set apart for open sessions on science-society interface touching upon the mentioned thematic areas as well as for an exhibition on rice and rice-related products and activities.

DAY ONE (20-8-2004): TECHNICAL SESSION

Invited speakers will present papers on the following thematic areas related to medicinal and aromatic rice:

Theme areas

- 1. Conservation, Evaluation, Purification and Genetic Improvement.
- 2. Biochemical and Molecular Characterization.
- 3. Therapeutic Uses and Medicinal Properties.
- 4. Validation of Indigenous Knowledge and IPR Issues.

The presentations will be made from a gendered perspective, except where it is not relevant.
