7. MESSAGES THAT MOVE

The three sets of spots (discussion starters) focusses on issues related to women and child care problems of the present day. The three songs in addition to problems highlights on playway as a joyful method of learning.

- a. Gender Justice, the rights of women and children (6 spots) Emphasises the need to recognise the triple roles of women as workers, mothers and homemakers. State and society can support women and girls to enable them enjoy their rights to live and develop as full human beings. 1996 - 1998
- b. Development of the child below three (5 spots) The film shows how the day-to-day behaviour of adults and their interactions with children affect the development of the young child (0-3 years) and suggests that nurturance and stimulation are important for the child in supporting the child's development.
